The SSBA is pleased to offer **Introductory** and **Intermediate** botanical art courses in the north and south of Scotland, both for beginners and those with some experience.

The courses are open to SSBA members, other individuals and art groups in the south and north of Scotland. There will be 8 courses, with 12 places available on each course.

Funded by the Finnis Scott Foundation, the training course tuition is offered free to artists. Art materials, travel, accommodation and evening meal costs are not included.

Background

Botanical Illustration goes back to the 16th century with works by Leonardo da Vinci. From then on, many painters were depicting botanical art. Botanical Illustration was the original method used by artists who travelled with the early explorers to record the new species they found as they explored the world.

Today detailed plant portraits are still used as scientific images for things such as botanical textbooks but it has also evolved into an art form.

Botanical art today, although botanically correct, often has a more aesthetic quality. Artists are constantly pushing the boundaries and produce amazing art works.

These intensive courses aim to introduce you to this world and help you appreciate the fine detail in flowers, trees, vegetables and much more and then how to record them.





Course Overviews

The **Introductory** course is for anyone interested in exploring Botanical Art and although watercolour experience is not essential it would certainly help.

Over the weekend you will be introduced to:

- The materials used such as paper, paints, pencils, etc
- The relevance of detailed observation of your subject
- The importance of accurate measurement of your subject and the relevance of perspective
- The relevance and importance of dark and light in your painting, tonal values
- The basics of watercolour paint application with accurate colour matching

The **Intermediate** course is aimed at helping the participants to further develop their botanical art skills and previous experience is necessary.

It will cover different techniques used in botanical painting, such as dry brush work, stippling, fine detail, enlarging subjects, etc.

Over the weekend you will:

- Review materials used, measurement and watercolour techniques
- Have the opportunity to appreciate the effectiveness of tonal values to create depth and perspective
- Be introduced to different painting techniques





- Look at how to achieve shine and fine details, such as hairs
- Look at methods used to correct mistakes!
- Explore different types of composition

Both courses will comprise group demonstrations followed by personal practice. Individual guidance will also be given as required. A list of materials required for each course will be sent out when you are accepted onto the course.

Venues

South of Scotland Courses - Dumfries

The venue for the south of Scotland is the town of Dumfries, in Dumfries & Galloway. Dumfries is on the A75, a short distance from the A74(M) accessible by bus as well as by car.

The courses will be held at <u>Crichton Central</u> on the southern outskirts of Dumfries.

Single occupancy room accommodation is available at the nearby <u>Holiday Inn.</u>, a 6-minute walk from the meeting room.

If you prefer to arrange your own accommodation, or live within daily travelling distance, we'd be delighted if you would still join us for dinner early on the Saturday evening after the course as an opportunity to socialise with other attendees.





North of Scotland Courses - Aviemore

The venue for the north of Scotland courses is Aviemore, in the Cairngorms National Park. Aviemore is just 31 miles from Inverness and 93 miles from Aberdeen. It's on the Highland Main Line train service and accessible from across Scotland by bus as well as by car.

The courses will be held at <u>Macdonald Aviemore Resort Conference Centre</u>. Accommodation is available at the <u>Macdonald Highlands Hotel</u> next door, just a 3-minute walk from the meeting room.

If you prefer to arrange your own accommodation, or live within daily travelling distance, we'd be delighted if you would still join us for dinner early on the Saturday evening after the course as an opportunity to socialise with other attendees.

Costs

Funded by the Finnis Scott Foundation Botanical Art Prize 2022, www.finnis-scott-foundation.org.uk, the SSBA course tutoring plus tea, coffee and lunch during the course is provided free of charge to attendees.

Attendees will need to cover own costs for travel, art materials and, where required, accommodation, breakfast and dinner.
